



Dr. Jeff Moses Mini-Bio Introduction

Dr. Moses was born in Japan and naturalized as a US Citizen at the age of 11. Having graduated CUM LAUDE from UCSD with a Major in Biomedical Engineering and a Minor in Social Psychology, he then went on to graduate CUM LAUDE from UOP Dental School with many National Honors. He served as a dental officer in the US NAVY finishing with the rank of Lt. Commander.

Dr. Moses is American Board Certified in Dental General Anesthesiology and Pain Management as well as in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery and in 2001 was awarded status as full professor of Maxillofacial Surgery at Loma Linda and an Adjunct Assistant Professor at UCLA.





As the founder of the first academic and professionally recognized TMJ arthroscopic anatomical cadaveric « hands-on » training course developed in 1984, he has sponsored and participated in the training of hundreds of Oral and Maxillofacial surgeons for their development of excellence in the field of TMJ arthroscopic surgery. Having published numerous landmark professional publications illustrating the proper use and techniques of basic and advanced TMJ arthroscopic surgery, his peer-reviewed academic papers and book chapters helped pioneer the foundation for the success-rate verifications used by the insurance industry to authorize the procedures as standard practice for reimbursement qualifications.

Currently still teaching and service as the President and Founder of the Pacific Clinical Research Foundation with respective counterparts, The Moses Institute, and the Smiles International Foundation, after 30 years of academic teaching and clinical practice, Dr. Moses retired and sold his surgery center to continue his service efforts forming both educational miniresidency and fellowship opportunities in TMD management as well as continuing to provide the charitable services for Rotary-Smiles Facial Cleft-Surgical Mission Teams worldwide.
